

In the three-year reference period (2015-2017), 68 students were enrolled in seven PhD programmes of the Department of Human Neurosciences (Sensory-Motor Neurosciences, Experimental Neurology, Neurorehabilitation, Neurological Disturbances, Child Neurodevelopment and Psychiatry, Pathology of the Auditory System, Psychiatry and Neurophysiology ). Sixty-four of those enrolled regularly obtained the passage to the subsequent year, whereas four abandoned the PhD programme for health reasons or transferred to other locations due to work.

In the 2015-2017 triennium, four students from foreign calls also participated in PhD programmes (including the Early-Stage Researcher winners in the Marie Skłodowska project - Neurophysiology).

PhD students had the opportunity to carry out research activities at qualified European institutions.

PhD students also had the opportunity to attend educational training events, including seminars, and were involved in thesis preparation and tutoring activities for students of Medicine and Surgery and of the Specialisation Schools belonging to the Department.

The scientific activity carried out by doctoral students is reflected in the high quality and quantity of scientific publications (a total of 325 publications in international scientific journals in the triennium 2015-2017).
